When water is clean and plentiful, people often drink, irrigate their crops, and wash their clothes and bodies without much thought. In places where water is scarce people must walk long distances to fetch it. In the developing world, many people rely on natural water

sources such as streams and rivers for their water. However, the same water used for drinking is used to graze and water animals as well as for dumping waste. At any time, 1.5 million people suffer from parasitic worm infections stemming from human solid waste in the environment.



Today

Today is the third Sunday of Advent. During these weeks leading up to Christmas, we are focusing on our inner longing for God's mercy to flood through us. As God pours mercy into our lives, we become people who can reflect Christ's light in our everyday living.

John the Baptist exhorts the people to produce fruit in keeping with repentance (Luke 3:8a). Repentance is much more than simple words; it is a change in lifestyle. With specific examples directed toward the crowds, tax collectors, and soldiers, John prepares a people to embrace Jesus' way of love and peace. John is preparing a Kingdom crop; Jesus will gather it in. In response to John's words, may we live in ways that produce fruit in keeping with our repentance. And may the God of peace be with us.
