Today we continue our journey through the Gospel of Mark. We have already experienced Jesus as the one who teaches in parables and heals the sick. Today, we will reflect on Jesus as the one who performs mighty miracles. While his teaching, healings, and miracles amazed the crowds, Jesus didn't do any of these things to gain popularity. Rather, Jesus did everything to proclaim and embody the good news of God's Kingdom. With this in mind, this morning we will reflect on two miracles placed back-to-back in Mark's narrative: the feeding of the five thousand and Jesus walking on water (Mark 6:30-52). Instead of blind amazement, let us receive these stories with open hearts and allow them to invigorate our imaginations for faithful living today.
