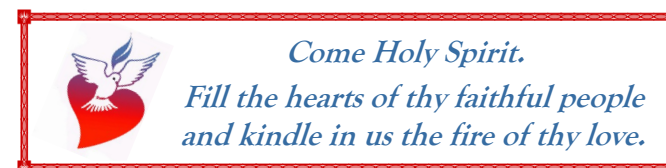

Positive year-end response to IBA funding crisis: Thanks to a year-end wave of financial gifts for Mennonite Education Agency's (MEA) Hispanic Pastoral and Leadership Education (HPLE) office, Instituto Bíblico Anabautista (IBA, or Anabaptist Biblical Institute) will not face potential program reductions in the coming months. An additional \$22,000 needs to be raised during the current fiscal year, which ends on July 31, 2014. "We are very grateful for this outpouring of gifts," said Ken Gingerich, MEA development associate. "While this is not a huge amount when compared to what other educational organizations raise, in our situation it is absolutely life giving." *For complete article, please see Community Announcement Sheet. Tabor Church Thanksgiving and Christmas Day offerings totaling \$1550.50 were designated for IBA.*
