Phil's Ponderings

"Building God's Kingdom"

"Consequently, you are no longer foreigners and strangers, but fellow citizens with God's people and also members of his household, built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the chief cornerstone. In him the whole building is joined together and rises to become a holy temple in the Lord. And in him you too are being built together to become a dwelling in which God lives by his Spirit." (Ephesians 2:19-22).

Tabor Church Family,

I am excited about many things, including the fall weather, my son learning to walk, and many energizing ministry opportunities at church. One ministry opportunity I am especially excited about is our upcoming Sunday morning worship series, which will focus on the theme, "Building God's Kingdom."

Most of the ideas for this series came from two different places:

First, our Adult Bible Study on Wednesday evenings is studying the book, *Missional Essentials: A Guide for Experiencing God's Mission in Your Life.* In this study, we are reflecting on God as a missionary God who sends a missionary church to join God's mission of healing and restoration in our local communities. We are all participants in God's larger kingdom mission.

Second, our church is moving forward with raising funds for a significant building project. Our theme for this project is "Building Hospitality, Healing, and Hope with our Time, Talents, and Treasures." The purpose of our Building project is not simply to have a nice building built for us. Even more importantly, the purpose is to draw together as a community in order to build something that will help us extend God's hospitality, healing, and hope to our neighbors.

With both the Bible Study and the building project in mind, on Sunday mornings, we will be reflecting on scripture passages that describe different biblical building projects, including building the Tower of Babel, the Tabernacle, the Temple, God's people into a new temple, and the Body of Christ. As we reflect on these building projects in conjunction with our own building project, we will continuously need to remind ourselves that God is the builder and Christ is the cornerstone. As followers of Jesus, we join God in building God's kingdom. And as we join God at work, God will give us the tools we need through the power of the Holy Spirit.

One song that I hope will serve as a theme song for this worship series is "Build Your Kingdom Here" by the group "Rend Collective." Following is the chorus of the song, which is also my prayer as we journey forward as a faith family.

"Build Your kingdom here, Let the darkness fear Show Your mighty hand, Heal our streets and land Set Your church on fire, Win this nation back Change the atmosphere, Build Your kingdom here We pray"

Here is our monthly marriage moment: a meaningful memento to married couples to make your marriages marvelous!

John Gottman, marriage researcher, has written a book entitled *The Seven Principles for Making Marriage Work*. Last month, we focused on Principle 2: "Nurture Your Fondness and Admiration."

The third of the seven principles is "turn toward each other instead of away." Gottman says, "In marriage, couples are always making what I call "bids" for each other's attention, affection, humor, or support. Bids can be as minor as asking for a backrub or as significant as seeking help in carrying the burden when an aging parent is ill. The partner responds to each bid either by turning toward the spouse or turning away. A tendency to turn toward your partner is the basis of trust, emotional connection, passion, and a satisfying sex life." Furthermore, according to Gottman's research, "we found that couples who remained married had turned toward their partner's bids an average of 86 percent of the time in the Love Lab, while those who ended up divorced had averaged only 33 percent." This research emphasizes the importance of being aware of each other's bids for attention and responding positively to them. When couples turn toward each other, they are crediting what Gottman calls their "emotional bank account": "They are building up savings that, like money in the bank, can serve as a cushion when times get rough, when they're faced with a major life stress or conflict."³

Marriage Challenge:

Seek to be more aware of your partner's bids for attention. Then, when your partner makes a bid for attention, no matter how small, seek to respond to it positively by turning toward her/him. Turn off the electronic device, put down whatever you are doing, and embrace the opportunity to connect in many small but significant ways each and every day.

With a little work, you too can make your marriage marvelous ②.

Grace's Goodies

Coconut Walnut Bread Kirby House Signature Bread

- -2 cups flour
- -1 3/4 tsp. baking powder
- -1/4th tsp salt
- -1/4th tsp baking soda
- -1 1/3 cup sugar
- -2/3 cup veg. oil
- -2/3 cup buttermilk
- -1/2 cup flaked coconut
- -2 large eggs
- -1/2 tsp coconut flavor
- -1/2 cup chopped walnuts
- -Preheat oven to 325 degrees. Spray bottom of 9X5" loaf pan with non stick cooking spray.
- -Mix the dry ingredients in large mixing bowl. Add oil, buttermilk, coconut, eggs, coconut flavor and walnuts to flour mixture. Mix with electric mixer just until ingredients are moistened.
- -Pour into prepared pan and bake for 1 hr. and 15 min or until done (toothpick check). Do Not open oven door during baking (to avoid bread sinking in center).
- -Cool on wire rack. When cool run knife around edge of pan and remove from pan. Wrap and store in fridge or freezer up to 2 months.
- -Do not slice until chilled and firm. After slicing, butter and grill lightly on both sides.

To most of us, the thought of worshipping an idol is unthinkable—stupid, even. How could anyone pray to a "thing" made with human hands?

But if we take a moment to contemplate the meaning of the word "idol", and the word "worship" and how we do it, we need to think again. Through the years people have worshipped nature, and animals, as well as some humans they felt were superior beings. In addition to adoration, most of their worship included offerings, or some form of sacrifice from money to things to animals, and at times, even child sacrifice. Some even included prostitution and other actions and activities in the name of "giving your all" to what you felt was most important in your life.
