Sunday, April 26

Come together in spirit to worship God and experience God's love. As we unite our hearts, may we be mindful of God's saving grace, especially as we face difficult circumstances through uncertain times.

The gathering hymn, *Take thou my hand, O Father,* was written by the Baltic German poet, Julie Katharina Von Hausmann (born in 1826). In the original German language, it was called "So Nimm Denn Meine Hande." It quickly became a favorite hymn of Mennonites in Southern Russia. It was frequently sung at solemn occasions, such as funerals and the departure of friends and family who immigrated to North America. This song was recently sung at a MCC Centennial Celebration service held at Tabor College on February 29.

About this Sunday's Scripture: John Coffman proposed to the MCC Executive Committee that it adopt a motto for its work, a brief and clear statement expressing MCC's motivation. He suggested "In the name of Christ," taken from Mark 9:41. In 1944 this phrase was adopted as MCC's official motto.
