# **Tabor Church Food Pantry:**

Due to restrictions and recommendations surrounding COVID-19, the Tabor Church Food Pantry has implemented the following policy:

We will continue to serve those in need by providing basic grocery items from what we have available at the time. When we receive a call, people may request specific items and we will include those items in their bags if we have them. We will have a limit of two bags of groceries and a \$50 card to Keith's Food for perishable items. When people arrive to pick up their groceries, we will have them at the door to take out to their car.

At this time, rather than ask for donations of grocery items from the wider community, we are asking for monetary donations. We will buy the groceries to keep our shelves stocked. You may send your donation to Tabor Mennonite Church, 891 Chisholm Trail, Newton, KS 67114.
