

Payroll Protection Program update:

This week the church council has diligently discerned details concerning the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) funding opportunity. Tabor Mennonite Church has been approved from Small Business Administration (SBA) through Citizen's State Bank to receive a disbursement from the second round of funding for the PPP in the amount of \$31,900.00. The PPP loans are made available to small businesses and non-profits and will be forgiven when used for payroll and utilities in an 8-week time frame after received. Since it is unknown how Tabor's members and financial giving will be affected during this COVID-19 pandemic time, these funds will assist us in meeting budget. It is also our hope that with the continued giving and generosity of Tabor's members that we can also fund crisis needs in our congregation and community.

Junior High Camp: We need to share a difficult decision with you: Camp Tawakoni 2020 is cancelled. As we thought about the risks and challenges of being at camp in the midst of a pandemic, we decided we could not run our camp in a safe and responsible manner. This decision was not an easy one for us to make. For the first time in almost sixty years, the Goessel Community Junior High won't be heading to camp during the Memorial Day weekend. We mourn the loss of strengthened relationships with God, youth, friends, and nature. We realize how important this weekend is for our junior highers and nurturing their faith. We would still like to connect with the junior highers in other ways, even though we are apart. We are also hoping for another event with the entire junior high this summer.

Blood Drive Coming in June: Much has changed in the last months, but one thing that is not different is the need for blood.
