As a follow-up to Emil Schmidt's faith sharing last Sunday, the Deacons are encouraging the congregation to consider how each of us can continue to carry on the Tabor tradition of working for peace and justice. Options include: reading books on a peace and justice issue, especially racial injustice during this time. Pastor Phil and several others have indicated interest in doing a book study, so contact him if that interests you. Another option is to walk from the church to the Tabor sign at K-15 highway, and spend that time praying and reflecting. A third option is watching documentaries and movies that educate us on racial injustice--one example is "13th." And, if you are interested in being part of a group that helps educate the Tabor family about current justice and peace issues, let a deacon know.

Each delegate will need their own smartphone or computer with a webcam and speaker in order to facilitate voting during the morning delegate session. Non-delegates may join without registering! Non-delegates may observe and comment on the delegate session via YouTube Live, as well as join in live, interactive and recorded webinars.

Red Cross blood drive – Aug. 10, 1-6 pm, at Goessel Mennonite Church. For a limited time, the Red Cross is testing ALL donated blood for COVID-19 antibodies. Donors will be notified of their results, which will indicate if they have been exposed to the COVID-19 and therefore developed antibodies. (Red Cross is not testing to diagnosis illness.) In addition to the extra need for blood during this pandemic, 25% of the nation's blood supply helps people receiving treatments for cancer. Every minute 5 units of blood are needed to help someone going through cancer treatments. Sign up to donate at redcrossblood.org or call Rosi (356-2418) or Nancy (367-2610) for assistance. There are only 11 spots still open so act soon.
