In light of concerns about coronavirus (COVID-19), all in-person meetings and events at Tabor are cancelled/postponed until further notice. In addition, to help prevent the spread of germs, Tabor Church will remain locked at all times. If you have a need to enter the church building, please call the church at 367-2318. If the need is urgent, you may contact a Trustee as well. Please care for yourself and reach out to a pastor or deacon if you have any concerns or needs for yourself or others.

You have all received the document of Guidance for Resuming In-Person Gatherings on Tabor property and a survey. Please fill out and return the survey by June 10 to give us a better idea of how best to prepare the facility when we do decide to resume in-person worship. It will let us know how many of you are thinking of attending a worship time which will help us prepare either the Hospitality Hall or the sanctuary for the number of persons expected. The church council met this last week and we have not yet set a date for resuming in-person worship services. The church will remain locked until further notice and closed to any outside groups who would want to reserve the facility, at least through the summer.

We will, however, welcome any small groups of our Tabor community who would like to meet on church property which would be in the Hospitality Hall, the park, or other outdoor areas. We expect all who gather to follow the guidelines that have been presented which includes social distancing and wearing masks. If you want to meet in the Hospitality Hall please call or e-mail Kim Funk to reserve the space one week in advance with a tentative list of people to attend. To give Camille, our custodian, 3 days in between to clean and disinfect the space, we will not be able to schedule more than 2 groups per week. After your event you will need to give Kim a list of those persons who attended.

It is our hope and intention to help our Tabor community feel love, care, connection and inclusion during this difficult COVID19 time. If you have concerns or needs that have not been met please don't hesitate to call or e-mail Pastor Phil or Gayle Funk.
