# **Congregational Announcements**

Worship at Tabor: Duane Duerksen, Gayle Funk, and Erica Stoltzfus

met Wednesday evening to discuss criteria for in-person worship at Tabor Church. We recommend following the Kansas Department of Health and Environment School Gating Metrics (found here: https://public.tableau.com/profile/kdhe.epidemiology#!/vizhome/COVID-19TableauVersion2/GatingMetricsMaps). Hover your curser over the counties on the map to see the statistics. This is based on community testing positivity rates for the previous two week period; we will be looking at both Marion and Harvey counties. We will monitor this every Wednesday to make a decision regarding church for the upcoming Sunday. If positivity rates are between 5%-<15% (green, yellow, and orange color coding) in-person services may continue in the building. If positivity rates rise to 15% (red coding) or greater in either one or both counties, in-person services will be suspended until both counties drop below 15%. This week our positivity rate is 14.8% in Harvey County and 6.5% in Marion County, permitting in-person services. However, we would encourage members to use extra caution in making their decision regarding attending due to a new cluster of cases in the Goessel community.

Safe Sanctuary Training: All Adults who make an annual commitment to Tabor's Safe Sanctuary Policy – Teachers, Helpers, Youth Leaders, Mentors, Transporters – please attend a special Zoom training with Anna Groff, Executive Director of Dove's Nest this Sunday, October 25 at 10:45 a.m. Anna will be presenting for about 35-40 minutes and then allow 20 minutes for discussion. See the attached handout for her talking points which include an emphasis on safety and abuse prevention during COVID. This session will be recorded if you are unable to attend but we look forward to this opportunity to gather together to share as a community that cares for our children and youth, even in a year where we miss seeing their smilling faces in-person.
