On Tabor's Heights

Many people have used imagery and language of "exile" in thinking about the pandemic, drawing on the biblical stories of exile and lament. Our new worship series (which begins August 15) will focus on passages which highlight the period of return and rebuilding following the exile,



with stories from Ezra, Nehemiah, and the latter part of Isaiah. As with the biblical return from exile, there are still a lot of unknowns and things that feel uncertain as we move forward. Even with a return to some semblance of normalcy following the "exile" of the pandemic, there are many things that have changed, there are losses to lament, and there are things that are still unclear. How do we seek to rebuild what was lost because of the pandemic in the midst of so much uncertainty?

Our worship series title, "On Tabor's Heights," comes from the story of our congregation's name, which was influenced by the church's first pastor, P. H. Richert. "One of Richert's favorite expressions was 'on Tabor's Heights' and he is credited with having suggested the name." During this worship series, we will have the opportunity to hear additional stories from people who have been a part of Tabor for much of their lives. Our congregation has a rich and meaningful history that we can build upon. How have we journeyed through adversity and challenging times in the past? What common values and practices hold us together? What is important to us and what is it that makes us who we are as a congregation? It is our hope that these stories can continue to shape us, even as we prayerfully discern together where Christ may be leading our congregation in the future.

We recognize how important and meaningful it has been to share stories and reflections with one another around tables this summer. We look forward to further conversations later this month which will help us prayerfully discern where God may be leading us. As a part of this series, the CAFE class will provide an opportunity to continue to reflect and share with one another, focusing on similar questions to the ones asked by the deacons. We are also looking forward to hosting Jessica Schrock-Ringenberg of Hesston College, who will preach and lead adult faith formation on August 29. Her sermon is entitled "Inviting Community = Words + Actions."

Friends, even when things feel uncertain, we know who it is who holds us together. May we continue to build upon the firm foundation of Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior. Amen.

On Tuesday, July 27, the United States Women's Gymnastics Team competed in the team competition in Tokyo. The women finished with the silver medal, which is an amazing accomplishment on an international stage. However, the headline of the event was the withdrawal of Simone Biles from the competition. It was stated that she left the event for medical reasons, but was later further clarified to be for mental health concerns. Biles stated, "Physically, I feel good. Emotionally it varies on the time and moment. Coming to the Olympics and being head star isn't an easy feat." She has since removed herself from other events as well.

Going into the games, she was credited as being the best gymnast--or even athlete--in the world. This, in turn, causes a lot of pressure. She said that she feels the weight of the world on her shoulders to go out and perform with excellence and nothing less. This took a lot of strength on her part to withdraw from competition on the biggest stage on earth. Many were surprised with this announcement. However, she has received an overwhelming amount of support from people. She stated on Twitter, "the outpouring love & support I've received has made me realize I'm more than my accomplishments and gymnastics which I never truly believed before." We are all human.
