

#### SEPTEMBER COVID19 PROTOCOL

- --Due to the recent increases in Covid19 and the Delta variant, the CDC recommends that everyone (including vaccinated persons) **wear masks when indoors** in areas of high or substantial community transmission. We Strongly Encourage following this mask guidance at this time.
- --Every other pew in the sanctuary will be roped off for social distance seating.
