

COVID PROTOCOL FOR WEDNESDAY EVENING ACTIVITIES


- 1) Masks are to be worn by adults, youth, and children during the entire evening of activities whether you are inside or outside the church building and if you go on outings.
- 2) The only time masks can be removed is while eating the evening sack lunch meal. During the meal, please sit with your family and social distance 6 ft away from other groups. If your family is not attending, sit with your class group that you will be with the majority of the evening. As long as weather permits, please eat outside.
- 3) Sanitizer stations will be made available and please use these frequently.
- 4) PARENTS: If your children test positive with Covid OR there are Covid cases in your children's classroom at school you are to call, text or email one or all of the Covid Task Team by Tuesday evening. This will be our gauge of whether we ask a class not to meet the current Wed evening or whether we "call off" all Wed evening activities for the current week.
