Pastor Katherine's Review

To support the health and ministry of its pastors, our church conducts periodic in-depth reviews of our pastors' work and ministry which involve the entire congregation. The goal of these pastoral reviews has always been to **strengthen the ministry of our pastors.** The Deacons are leading this year's in-depth review for Pastor Katherine Goerzen. We will not have a congregation review at this time since we had extensive conversations before Pastor Todd was hired.

The process we will be using for Katherine's review this year is called "the Appreciative Way." The Appreciative Way process differs from other methods we have used in the past.

- Instead of using a congregation survey, we will be discussing review questions in small focus groups.
- The Appreciative Way shifts from a problem-based to a **strength-based approach**, while also identifying areas for growth in ministry.
- The primary focus is to identify "what is life-giving" and "what is working" so we can maximize Katherine's ministry at Tabor.
- Another important aspect of "the Appreciative Way" will be for Katherine to write a self-review using questions similar to the ones we will be discussing in focus groups.

The Deacons have assigned a leader and a recorder for each focus group. Leaders will guide the discussion and the recorder will write down your comments from the discussion. Notes from focus group recorders will be given to our Pastoral Review Advisor from the Western District Conference, Roger Neufeld Smith. Roger will write a draft report from the focus group notes and from Katherine's self-review. After sharing that draft with Katherine and with the Deacons for their comments and suggestions, Roger will write a final report to be shared with the congregation.

The date for these focus groups will be Sunday, May 7 during the Faith Formation time. All adults will have the opportunity to attend since the youth and youth sponsors will be doing their review on May 3, which will allow them, along with Pastor Katherine, to provide a time of fellowship and games for our children.
