The mission statement logo depicts a pitcher at the top which shows swirls of oil being poured out. The swirls, also seen in Tabor's seven worship banners, represent God's healing power. The open and receiving hand is a symbol of the hospitality of Tabor Church. The leaf on the lower right signifies hope for new growth."
